More Information Go to Eat Campaign

The government's "Go To" campaigns aim to help businesses that were hit by Covid-19. "Go To Travel" is up and running, giving 50% discounts for domestic trips. Now it is joined by "Go To Eat," with discounts on restaurant meals in your local area. You save money in two ways.

First, there are vouchers. Participating prefectures have different systems. In Tokyo, for example, you buy a book of 10 vouchers online for \$10,000. Each \$1000 voucher covers \$1,250 of a restaurant bill. In Tochigi, an \$8000 book of vouchers is worth \$10,000. Either way, it's a saving of 25%. Vouchers can be used at participating restaurants in the prefecture, but no change is given if you don't spend the whole voucher.

The second way to save is by making an online restaurant reservation at a booking site like Gurunavi, Tabelog or Hot Pepper. Each online reservation for a participating restaurant earns 500-yen's worth of points per person for lunch, and 1000 yen of points for dinner (3 p.m. onward). The points are awarded after you pay for your meal, and they can be used for future visits to participating restaurants.

Matsutake mushrooms are a delicious fall food, but they are expensive. If there is a hot summer and a rainy September, matsutake grow well. The weather was good for matsutake in Yamaguchi Prefecture this year. There are going to be more matsutake mushrooms than usual, so they are going to cost less than usual. However, Nagano and Gifu had a hotter-thanusual summer and not enough rain in September, so matsutake may be more expensive there. Matsutake mushrooms from Japan are going to be sold in stores until the end of October. (99 words)

More Information A good year for matsutake?

Matsutake mushrooms are an expensive fall delicacy. Their price varies from year to year depending on the harvest, and the harvest depends on the weather in summer and early fall. For a healthy crop, a hot summer followed by a cool, rainy September is ideal. How was the weather for matsutake this year? It seems to have depended on the area.

Asahi TV in Yamaguchi reported a good year for matsutake in its prefecture as there was plenty of fall rain and no typhoon damage. One store in the area expects 50% more matsutake mushrooms than usual to arrive, so prices should be 30% less than average. On the other hand, Nagano and Gifu had a hotter-than-usual summer followed by insufficient rain in September, so the harvest there is poor. Tamba-Sasayama (丹波篠山) in Hyogo Prefecture is one of the best matsutake growing areas in the country. On October 1, at the first auction of the year there, five matsutake mushrooms that weighed 95 grams in total were sold for ¥520,000.

Domestic matsutake mushrooms, at various prices, should be available in stores until the end of October.
