Almond milk

The word "milk" usually means cow's milk. It is also possible to make milk-like drinks from beans, grains, nuts and seeds. For years, soy milk has been the main alternative to cow's milk, but recently, almond milk sales have been increasing. The almond milk market is still just one-tenth of the soy milk market, but new almond milk products are appearing all the time. Why is almond getting more popular rather than—say—oat, rice, coconut or other non-dairy milks? Perhaps it's because we are becoming more health conscious.

Almond milk advocates point out that almonds are higher in fiber, calcium, vitamin E, riboflavin and niacin than any other tree nut. Almonds are low in carbohydrates but high in protein and healthful fats, and they contain no cholesterol. The vitamin E in almonds contains antioxidants, and it may lower the risk of Alzheimer's disease.

Almond milk is made of ground almonds and water. Manufacturers add thickeners, preservatives, sweeteners and flavorings. Unsweetened almond milk contains half the calories of unsweetened soy milk, and this low calorie count seems to be an important selling point.

Demon Slayer tourism

Demon Slayer tourism

On October 16, an animated movie called "Kimetsu no Yaiba (鬼滅の刃): Mugen Train / Demon Slayer: Infinity Train" was released in 400 theaters across the country. It made 20 billion yen in three weeks, with an audience of 15 million people. The story is set in the Taisho period 100 years ago. The main character Tanjiro's family was killed by demons, and his sister was turned into one. Now Tanjiro is fighting to make his sister human again.

When something is popular, others jump on the bandwagon, and Kimetsu no Yaiba is no exception. JR Kyushu owns the same Taisho-era steam locomotive that appears in the movie. With a "Mugen" nameplate on the front, it is making several runs from Kumamoto Station to Hakata Station in November. Tickets sold out quickly.

Demon Slayer is also proving a boon to tourism in Nara. Fuefuki-jinja Shrine is attracting visitors because one of its deities Hono Ikazuchi no Ookami (火雷大神) sounds like sword actions used in the story. Tourists are also flocking to a large rock called Ittou-seki (一刀石) that is cracked in half, like the rock that Tanjiro severs with his sword while he is training.
